- Special instructions

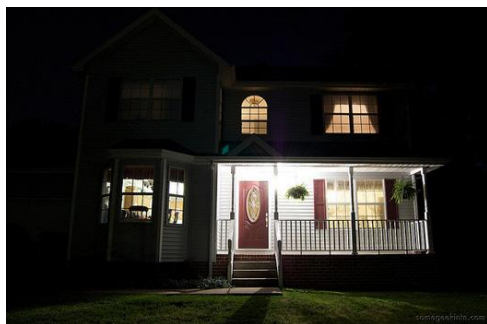




Calling 911
